

Michigan State University's Sustainable Built Environment Initiative to Assist the City of Gladstone in Developing a Future Vision for the North Shore Project on Little Bay de Noc

The City of Gladstone was successful in securing Michigan State University (MSU) assistance through a competitive application process to develop planning and design recommendations for the North Shore project area. The project area is nearly 50 acres of undeveloped property on Little Bay de Noc in Lake Michigan. A main goal of this project is to develop a long range conceptual master plan for the project site that will help guide future land use. A preferred vision of the project area will be developed using design images and planning recommendations as part of the MSU Sustainable Built Environment Initiative (SBEI) offered through the School of Planning, Design and Construction (SPDC) and Michigan State University Extension (MSUE).

A facilitated public input session will be held on **February 20, 2017 at the American Legion in Gladstone on 802 Delta Avenue beginning at 5:30PM**, appetizers will be available. Plan on a little socializing and bring your ideas to the table.



The SBEI initiative assists communities addressing the physical planning, design and land use issues of an area. It offers a graphic visioning process that provides citizens with a set of images and recommendations to guide improvements in their community with a sustainability theme. MSU Extension and the School of Planning, Design and Construction have jointly developed SBEI to address sustainability challenges and improve the quality of life in Michigan's communities.
